## The O'Neil Center Summer Reading Group

What is it? Students will have the opportunity to read two books over the summer and discuss them at the beginning of the fall 2020 semester. One of the two books all students will read will be *The Narrow Corridor* by Daron Acemoglu and James Robinson. Students will receive a \$500 stipend for their participation.

**Who is eligible?** All *rising* sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have participated in an O'Neil Center reading group are eligible to apply. However, only eight students will be selected to participate.

When will it happen? Students will meet for roughly a half hour at 3pm on the spring semester reading day on Tuesday, May 5<sup>th</sup>. Students will then meet for the full day on Saturday, August 29<sup>th</sup> for an intensive discussion.
